Officer Reports

Treasurer: Jeri Jo Blackmon distributed a sheet documenting Income & Expenses. Income: dues donations \$4439, Mugs \$620, Advertising: \$1300. Expenses: Easter egg hunt \$760, July 4 celebration: \$1514, LBC \$1025, welcome baskets: \$564. Net income: \$743. Although dues are not required, they are appreciated and help fund our neighborhood events. The dues drive began in May 2024 and runs through October. Old Business

Historic Book: Melanie Smith, primary author, provided an update. She recognized the following: Jim Peipert for his writing and photo contribution in the early stages, and Annette Gunter for editing the past 18 months. A new printing company in Korea will be used. Book details: coffee-table book, hardbound, approx 8.5" x 11" in size and 1 1/4" thick, nearly 600 pages and 800 photos. The color of the photos will be in sepia, which achieves a contrast that improves the look of the vintage images. It will be a 4-color press, which will be more expensive than initially planned. We have pre-sold 189 books and anticipate an additional 200 books to be sold.

Motion: move to recall the previous vote from the May 2024 meeting – "the neighborhood will expend additional funds not to exceed \$9000 to complete printing." Motion approved and seconded, no opposition. Motion passed.

What followed was a discussion on financing the book: current amount to publish 800 copies = \$16609, 700 copies = \$14979, 500 copies = \$12139. The publisher's prices are valid for 30 days from today, with half due upfront. Proposal: commitment to print 500 copies. If by September 30, 2024, there is enough interest in the book that exceeds 500, we will increase the print request to 700 copies. Book sale price \$50. Contribution history: Tarrant County Historical Society = \$1000, \$6000 from MHA (2020 meeting), pre-sale: \$2268, donations: \$6829.

Motion: 500 books with a \$12,159 additional cost as long as the file is to be printed by October 31. The presale decision deadline is September 30 if there is a commitment for an additional 200 books. The presale quantity to increase the print quantity to 700 is 200 copies. Approved, no opposition.

New Business

Guest speaker: Ana Alvarez, Planner City of FW Development services. Ms. Alvarez discussed the Historic preservation and historic overlay. It covers design guidelines, additions, windows, etc: https://www.fortworthtexas.gov/departments/development-services/preservation-urban-design/historic-preservation

FW City Council gives final approval. Work done on historic homes can provide tax breaks for a 10-year span. Examples of what qualifies are electrical, plumbing, and foundation. The most common violations are windows and additions. Certificate of appropriateness information is found online.
