April Yard of the Month

Congratulations to Susan and Jerry Heaton, at 2224 Weatherbee for their April Yard of the Month. Amy loved the pots filled with beautiful annuals and the blooming perennials in the beds, as well as the pretty young Magnolia tree in the middle of the lawn. I was excited, too, about what will be showing up later this month and into next.

Susan's many and varied pots grace the wide front steps and the porch wall, as well as in front of the small patio just off the porch on the left side of the house. Those on the front steps

sport red and while Geraniums, white Candytuft, yellow Yarrow, lemon lime Ssedum, purple Sweet Potato Vine, and Lavender, while the urns on either side of the door contain Ferns. There are two large black rectangular pots on the porch wall, with Ferns hanging above them, and a couple of smaller clay pots tucked between. The black pots contain a riot of bright colors provided by yellow Tickseed, orange and pink Petunias, and purple Sweet Potato Vine, while the smaller ones hold the greenery of a Mosquito plant







the same colorful blooms as on the porch wall, as is a black pot just behind it. Two cerulean blue pots hold golden Lantana and Autumn Joy Sedum, while a bird bath sparkles in their midst. And I won't turn attention away from this area before mentioning the wide swath of ferny-leafed, brighter-than-bright green Yarrow plants that fill the bed in front of the patio under a Crepe



Myrtle. Susan was given a small sprig of this Yarrow two years ago from a friend who passed away shortly thereafter. Her now-favorite plant of the garden has clearly loved its new home and we can anticipate its blanket of white flowers later in the spring and into summer.

Susan reports that the hard freeze a couple winters ago pretty much wiped out much of what had been a lovely garden (a Yard of the Month four years ago!), leaving her to start over with some new plants that are beginning to fill the main bed in front of the porch wall. This bed is lined at the front with a sweeping curve of limestone blocks that extends past the end of the house and toward the front walk. At the back of the

highlighting the patio at the end of the porch are particularly striking. A wide bowl on a wrought iron stand is covered in



bed, right along the porch wall, is a row of Pineapple Guava Shrubs. I have to admit, this was a new one to me! As I've learned, these evergreen bushes should fill in to make a nice greenish-gray hedge. Later in the spring, they'll feature pretty, edible, tropical-looking flowers which will turn into edible Guava-like fruits!


But we don't have to wait for flowers on about a half dozen Chinese Fringeflowers in front of the Guavas; their purplishpink display is always one of our earliest blooms. In front of the shrubs is a variety of smaller perennials, including Lambs Ear,

Candytuft, gold Yarrow. A couple nice clumps of Siberian Iris are beginning to put up their spiky new leaves, and will flower a bit later. Also in the "coming soon" department is a bed on the far side of the driveway, which holds a stand of Iris, a number of Knock-Out Roses. and a Crepe Myrtle, all of which will
