Tom Richey shares tips and information about restaurants in and around our neighborhood.

In the early 1980s while reading the Dallas Morning News, I saw an ad for a place called Campisi's Egyptian and wondered what Egyptian food might be like. Later on, I discovered that it was an Italian restaurant and at that point I really wondered why they would call it Egyptian — another mystery in my life.


Of course, since then, I have discovered the story. In 1950, "Pop" Campisi bought a bar on Mockingbird Lane in Dallas called "The Egyptian" and turned it into an Italian restaurant. He never removed the Egyptian sign and placed the Campisi sign above it, so the place seemed to be named Campisi's Egyptian. It was very successful and noted people like Mickey Mantle, Marlene Dietrich, and Tony Bennett dined there whenever they were in town. Apparently, there was some connection with Jack Ruby in the 1960s and Campisi family members testified in the Kennedy assassination probe. Since 1950, it has grown to nine locations, one of which is located on Camp Bowie in Fort Worth. Supposedly, Pop Campisi introduced pizza to Dallas in 1946 at a bar that predated the restaurant, which technically makes their origin 1946, I guess.

We have never been to the original location in Dallas (life's too short to spend time in Dallas), but we often go to the Camp Bowie facility. Our grandkids seem to enjoy it, we've taken them all there and being as it's a nice friendly space, they find it comfortable as do we. We like to go on Tuesdays for the spaghetti special, \$8.99 for garlic toast, house salad, and spaghetti plus 50% off for a bottle of wine — hard to beat that. Monday through Friday, they have a happy hour from 4:00 to 6:30 with \$2.00 off drinks and a selection of appetizers.

The regular menu has a goodly collection of appetizers, lasagna, a variety of pasta, and several specialties such as chicken parmigiana, shrimp scampi, veal scallopini, grilled salmon, veal parmigiana, and pizza (including gluten free) with all of the usual toppings.

Seating inside is comfortable and the service has always been good. There is also covered seating outside but close to the parking lot — although the grandkids seem to prefer that. All in all, it's a nice restaurant, the service is good, the food is good, and it's a decent family type location. I like it and it is worth a try if you've never been there.


